## MESSAGE FROM MR PEMBLETON



Dear Parents/Carers,

We have a few important updates to share with you:

### Breakfast Club Changes

We've made a decision regarding our Breakfast Club funding. While we currently receive toast for every child from Greggs, and also have access to a DfE free breakfast club scheme, we are unable to claim both simultaneously. To ensure all children continue to receive toast, we will be withdrawing from the DfE scheme. We will continue to provide the service until the end of this term. Rest assured, the **Breakfast Club will still continue** for those who need it, with a focus on providing toast to every child.

### Term Dates for 2025-2026

The **term dates for the next academic year**, including training days, have been released. Three training days are confirmed, and one will be made up of aggregated hours, meaning school will start for pupils on **Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2025** and Friday, **17th July 2026 will be the last day for pupils** and staff. An additional training day will be added later in the year. Please refer to the attached document for full details.

### Hygiene and Safety

Our site team has been managing some pest issues recently, primarily due to bin strikes. We are in regular contact with the council to address this promptly. We kindly ask that if you notice any issues with rubbish, pests or vermin, please **report it to the school immediately** so we can deal with it swiftly.

### School Attendance

We're delighted to report fantastic progress with our school attendance! Our **year-to-date attendance is now 95.0%**, with this week's attendance at 95.3%. This is a significant achievement, equating to **30,000 more present marks** this year, meaning on average, every child has received 20 more days of learning compared to last year. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring your child attends school regularly.

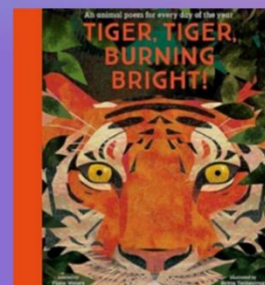
