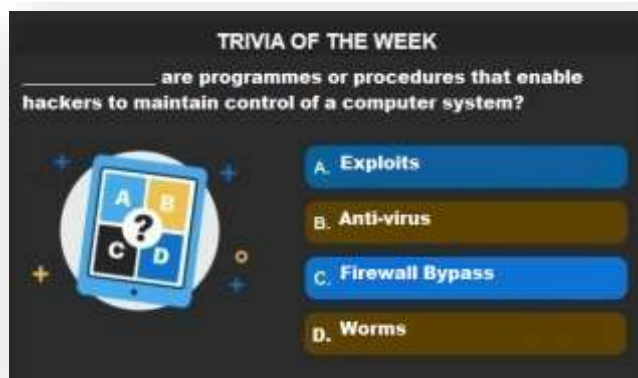
OCTOBER ONLINE SAFETY NEWSLETTER
