BELLBOATING

Mr Khan and Mr Baughan took 10 YR6 children to Stratford Upon Avon today to take part in the Main Regatta for Bell Boating. This was organised by David and Andrew Train, David spent 12 years as a Great Britain Olympic canoe coach and helped the teams who competed at the Los Angeles, Seoul, Barcelona and Atlanta games between 1984 and 1996.

David is also the person who invented bell boating in order that all abilities could get out onto the water and enjoy themselves in a safe and stable craft.

Andrew was a multi medal winning canoeist across a decade in the 1990's & 2000's who now campaigns for sustainability in conjunction with his dad, David and they both organise regattas across all areas like the one today.

The day started with a safety briefing, buoyancy aids being put on and then some instruction from the helmsmen. These are the neutral professionals who steer the bell boats and give any advice needed during the races.

The children were then allocated a boat, settled into their seats and set off up the River Avon to the start point. The whole event was in front of the RSC on the glorious river in bright, warm autumnal sunshine.

David was the official starter and once he said go, the sets of 3 boats in each race were off and paddling! The course was approximately 200m from start to finish.

Anglesey were in 3 races and came 2nd in each one!

They worked fantastically well together and were all in unison with their strokes, they really got the boats moving at quite a pace.

There was also an adult's event in which Yasmeen and Gulzar from Aspire - who have supported the school with bell boating sessions and Mr Baughan teamed up with 3 other adults from other schools and won their race!

Although Anglesey didn't receive any trophies this time, each team member was awarded a certificate and Anglesey got a stand out mention and a round of applause at the end. This was for not only travelling from Birmingham to take part but also on their fantastic achievements as they have never raced as a team before! All the other teams live close to the river and can practice plus they have all previously attended a regatta.

The children can be rightly, hugely proud of their efforts today in the race and in the representation of Anglesey as a force to be reckoned with in bell boating. Bring on next years event!

Before returning to school the children sat on the waterfront, with an ice cream, discussing their enjoyable but tiring day.

It was a huge pleasure to take the children and they should be immensely proud of what they have done today.
