
we can promote this value even further.

BEDTIME STORY REMINDER!


World Book Day is coming soon. Mrs Davies has organised lots of exciting events with authors who the children are familiar with.

NOTICES FOR PARENTS

HEADLICE

As a school there are sometimes cases of pupils who have caught headlice from contact with another child. This happens, but we can all do our best to reduce the number of cases.

- Check your child's hair regularly and use a fine-tooth comb (we have some in school if you need one)
- If you find any lice or eggs, then get the correct treatment from the pharmacy as soon as possible.
- Once you have used the first on your child's hair, they can be in school, but please make the class teacher aware.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Please try and make any appointments out of school time where possible, so your child does not lose time at school. If the appointment has to be in school time, please bring your child in before and after if possible.

ROAD CHANGES IN LOZELLS

The Council are revising the original plan, as the system, signage and bollards were causing significant issues for emergency vehicles and refuse collection, so they are implementing stage 1 immediately.

The main changes are:

- Church Street is one way from Nursery Road to Lozells Road
- Anglesey Street is one way from Lozells Road to Nursery Road
- Burbury Street will be 2 way between Nursery Road to Lozells Road
- The bollards will be removed also.

I am concerned on the impact of pupil safety before and after school, and the potential impact on punctuality so can we please keep alert to either of these issues.
