



# What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

# SNOPCHAT

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? Snapchat is a messaging app which allows users to send images, videos and tests to others. Its best known feature is that anything sent, disappears' 24 hours after it's been viewed; however, users are known to take screenshots or use another device to obtain a photo of their screen. In 2023, Snapchat added a chatbot function called "My Al".

#### SCAMS AND BLACKMAIL

Predotors can exploit Snopchat's disappearing messages feature by, for example, telling a user they have naked photos at them (regardless of whether it is true or not) and will share them online unless they send them money. Teens then (understandably) panic and worry about the long-term consequences. Snapchat's own research found that 65% of teenagers had experienced this - either on this app or others.



Snapchat works hard an user engagement, with leatures like streaks (messaging the same person every day to build up a high scare). The app also has sections colled Oiscover and "Spotlight". It claims the content shown here is relevant to each user, but it could also be seen as an easy way to hook users into watching videos endlessly. Furthermore,

#### INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some content on Snapchat simply isn't suitable for children. The hashtags used to group content are determined by the poster, so even an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's disappearing messages feature also makes it easy for young people to share explicit images on impulse - so sexting continues to be a risk associated with snapchat.

#### ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

My Al is Snapchat's new chatbot, which replies to questions in a human-like manner. However, the saftware is still in sits infancy and has significant drawbacks, such as biased incorrect or misleading responses. There have already been numerous reports of young users turning to Al for medical help and diagnoses, which could be inaccurate and therefore potentially dangerous.

#### **ONLINE PRESSURES**

Although many of Snapchat's filters are designed to entertain or amuse, the 'beautity' effects an photos can set unrealistic body image expectations creating feelings of inodequacy if a young person compares themselves unfavourably with other users. Snapchat now also has 'pricerty' netflications (which still get displayed even if a device is in do not disfusion mode), increasing the pressure on users to log back in and interact.

#### VISIBLE LOCATION

A feature called "SnapMaps" highlights your device"s exact position on a virtual map, which is visible to other users. There are options to restrict who can see this information: all friends, selected friends or just you. Snapchat also has real-time location sharing, which is intended as a buddy system to help friends keep track of each other - but it could also be used to track a young person for more sinister reasons.

# Advice for Parents & Educators

#NOFILTER

#### SET CONTROLS VIA FAMILY CENTRE

Snapchot has parental controls called Family Centre!. You must invite a child to the Family Centre for their to join. This allows you to view their triends list, see who they have chatted with in the last? days (but not to view the specific messages) and report ony concerns.



#### TALK ABOUT REAL LIFE SCAMS

If a young person is mature enough to have snapchal, then they are mature enough to have a conversation about scome, incles and blackmait, have this discussion before you let them join. Share some real-life examples. Discuss the importance of never adding strangers and discourage them from sharing nucles. If they are hared into a scam, encourage them to set you immediately, then block and delets the predator and screenshot any evidence.

## DISCUSS AI

Although My Al's responses can often give the impression that it's a real person, it's essential that young people remember this certainly lan't the case. Encourage children to think critically about My Al's replies to their questions, are they accurate and reliable? Remind them that My Al shouldn't replace chatting with their real friends, and that it's always better to talk to an actual person in relation to medical matters.

#### CHAT ABOUT CONTENT

It may feel like an awkward conversation (and one that young people can be relucted to have) but if it important to talk openly and non-judgementally obsult setting. #### BE READY TO BLOCK AND REPORT

If a stranger does connect with a child on Snapchaf and begins to make them feel uncomfortable through bullying, pressure to send explicit images or by sending secual images to them, the child can select the three dats on that person's profile and report or block them. There are options to state why they as reporting that user — such as connaying or malicious messages, spam or masquerading as someone else.
