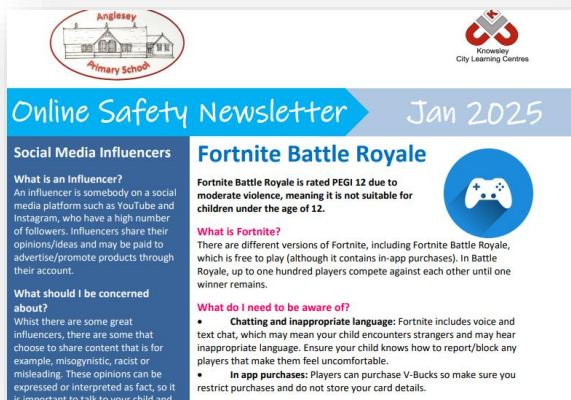

## FIRST AID IN SCHOOL



Below is some information for you about changes in communication of first aid treatment in school.

- **Head Bump Wristband** – All children who are treated for a head injury when there is a risk of concussion will be given a wristband and include; Name, Class, date and time of the injury on the wristband.
- **Text Message for minor injuries:** The office will send a text message to any parents whose child has had a minor injury to let you know that your child has received first aid. This could be for a minor injury such as a grazed knee or there may not be any visible marks following first aid treatment.

The message will say '*your child's name*' has received first aid treatment today for a minor injury. They can remain in school.

If you should require further information, the office staff can access 'Medical Tracker' for further information. Medical Tracker is where staff record any first aid incident.

- **Phone Call for more serious injuries:** For major or more serious head injuries we will phone advising you of what has happened, and whether your child needs to be collected for urgent medical attention.

If the child is to be collected from school, the office staff will print a copy of medical tracker report for the parents to take with them.

In the event of a serious injury, we will of course call 999 for advice and telephone parents.

## Head Injury Advice Sheet

Advice for parents and carers of children



### How is your child?



RED

If your child has any of the following during the next 48 hours:

- Vomits repeatedly i.e. more than twice (at least 10 minutes between each vomit)
- Becomes confused or unaware of their surroundings
- Loses consciousness, becomes drowsy or difficult to wake
- Has a convulsion or fit
- Develops difficulty speaking or understanding what you are saying
- Develops weakness in their arms and legs or starts losing their balance
- Develops problems with their eyesight
- Has clear fluid coming out of their nose or ears
- Does not wake for feeds or cries constantly and cannot be soothed

**You need urgent help**

Go to the nearest Hospital Emergency (A&E) Department or phone 999



AMBER

If your child has any of the following during the next 48 hours:

- Develops a persistent headache that doesn't go away (despite painkillers such as paracetamol or ibuprofen)
- Develops a worsening headache

**You need to contact a doctor or nurse today**

Please ring your GP surgery or call NHS 111 - dial 111



GREEN

If your child:

- Is alert and interacts with you
- Vomits, but only up to twice
- Experiences mild headaches, struggles to concentrate, lacks appetite or has problems sleeping

If you are very concerned about these symptoms or they go on for more than 2 months, make an appointment to see your GP.

**Self Care**

Continue providing your child's care at home. If you are still concerned about your child, call NHS 111 – dial 111
