
JANUARY ONLINE SAFETY NEWSLETTER



SAFETY FENCING

Be aware that on the corner of Nursery Rd near the pedestrian crossing, Highways are inserting safety fencing. This is to stop people parking on the grass and pavement and will help to keep our children safer.

This does mean that there will be a vehicle and tools on the footpath along with generator noise, so stay safe with your child.

ALSO, Highways will be repairing the accident damaged fence on Nursery Rd so there is no temporary barrier blocking the pavement now. Take extra care, when walking with your child.
