YEAR 5 DEBATING TEAM

On Friday 3rd May took we took 6, YR5 children to King Edwards Edgbaston to take part in a debating competition against another school.

After introductions and a few warm up games, the format of the session was explained by the King Edwards pupils – who were lower 6th and debating competition finalists themselves!

The competition involved 2 pupils as a team from each school putting forward either a proposition or opposition on the subject of “why we should have 3-day weekends all the time”.



Each team of 2 had at least 1 coach from the King Edwards pupils’ group to support and guide them through such things as: main points, short positive statements, presentation and where to look etc.



They then split then into 3 rooms. The debates began with one team presenting the proposition with the other then presenting their opposition. Each team was judged by a King Edwards pupil who had not been involved in the coaching of that particular group.

After all the arguments had been heard, the pupils were back into the one room whilst the scores were collated.



The tutors and the pupils of King Edwards thanked the schools for coming and were very complimentary of the level of conduct and debating performances.

The results were outstanding for Anglesey!

Not only did all of our children win their respective debating sessions, a clean sweep, 2 of them also won speaker of the session!

Certificates, medals and badges were awarded to a background of applause.
